DIVISION INDIGENOUS PEOPLES EDUCATION SUMMIT CUM IPED RESEARCH CONGRESS

TO: Assistant Schools Division Superintendent Public Schools District Supervisors Public Elementary and Secondary Schoolheads

- 1. The Curriculum Implementation Division (CID) will conduct a Division Indigenous Peoples Summit Cum IPEd Research Congress on **July 4, 2025**, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., at the Provincial Capitol Gymnasium, Alabel, Sarangani Province.
- 2. This activity represents a significant event designed to bridge traditional knowledge with contemporary educational practices. The summit will bring together Indigenous Peoples (IP) elders, educators, researchers, and community leaders to foster meaningful dialogue and share valuable insights on Indigenous Peoples Education.
- 3. This IPEd Summit aims to:
 - facilitate cultural knowledge preservation and integration by promoting meaningful dialogue between IP elders and educational stakeholders, ensuring that traditional knowledge systems are properly documented, respected, and integrated into curriculum;
 - b. focuses on research-based educational enhancement through the presentation and dissemination of current research findings on Indigenous Peoples Education, providing evidence-based insights that can inform policy development and improve educational outcomes for IP communities; and
 - c. build collaborative partnerships by strengthening relationships between IP communities, educational institutions, and government agencies, fostering sustainable partnerships that support culturally responsive and inclusive education initiatives.
- 4. Enclosed are the action research guidelines, list of participants and the activity matrix.
- 5. All participants are encouraged to wear IP attire or IP accessories to honor and give meaning to the activity. It is further encouraged that the conduct of these activities shall adhere to DepEd Order 51, s. 2014 (Guidelines on the Conduct of Activities and Use of Materials Involving Aspects of Indigenous Peoples Culture) as reference in the implementation of activities to ensure adherence to ethical standards.







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- 6. Meals and other expenses related to the conduct of this activity shall be charged against the IPEd Program Support Fund (PSF) 2024 while travel expenses of participants shall be charged against local funds/School MOOE, subject to the usual accounting and auditing procedures.

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Enclosure 1: Action Research Guidelines

GUIDELINES ON THE CONDUCT OF IPED ACTION RESEARCH CONGRESS DURING DIVISION IPED SUMMIT 2025

- 1. The Division will conduct Action Research in line with the IPED Summit on July 4, 2025, at the Provincial Capitol Gymnasium, Alabel, Sarangani Province. This activity aims to empower teachers by showcasing evidence-based innovations that address the challenges and gaps encountered in schools related to various IPED topics and concepts.
- 2. Each of the 7 municipalities in the Sarangani Division is required to submit 4 entries: two Action Researches for oral presentations and two Action Researches for poster presentations. Each entry must include three copies of the manuscript for review during the event. A total of 28 research entries will be presented.
- 3. The topics must be directly relevant to Indigenous Peoples Education (IPED). Entries with irrelevant topics will not be accepted for presentation. All oral and poster entries must be submitted by July 1, 2025, three days prior to the event, through this link: Google Drive Submission Link.
- 4. A panel of adjudicators will review the research reports. Researchers, both for oral and poster presentations, should be prepared for interpellation, which includes receiving suggestions and recommendations from the panel.
- 5. The IPED Research Congress will adopt the guidelines set forth by the Basic Education Research Agenda (BERA). The Research Agenda builds on existing research, generates new contributions to the body of knowledge on priority research areas, focuses on relevant educational issues, and maximizes available research resources both within and outside the Department of Education.
- 6. As such, researchers may opt to present their work under any of the following research themes, within the context of Indigenous Peoples Education:

Theme 1: Teaching and Learning





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Theme 2: Child Protection

Theme 3: Human Resource Development

Theme 4: Governance

Cross-cutting themes: Disaster Risk Reduction and Management (DRRM), Inclusive Education, and Gender and Development.

6. Research Content and Format

Printed manuscript must be in Arial 12 single space (maximum of 3500 words)

The full version of the paper shall have the following parts:

- II. Abstract
- III. Acknowledgement
- IV. Context and Rationale
- V. Innovation, Intervention, and Strategy
- VI. Action Research Questions
- VII. Action Research Methods
 - a. Participants and/or other Sources of Data and Information
 - b. Data Gathering Methods
- VIII. Discussion of Results and Reflection
- IX. Conclusion and Recommendation
- X. Action Plan
- XI. References

Paper presenters shall be guided by the following pointers:

- a. The oral presentation shall last for 3-5 minutes per oral presenter with 3 minutes feedback from the assigned adjudicator.
- b. The content of the slide presentation shall be composed of:
 - Slide 1- Title with proponent's name
 - Slide 2- Context and Rationale
 - Slide 3- Innovation / Intervention / Strategy
 - Slide 4-Research Questions
 - Slide 5- Research Methods
 - Slide 6-Discussion of Result and Reflection
 - Slide 7- Conclusion and Recommendation
 - Slide 8- Action Plan
 - Slide 9- References







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For poster, please use vertical (portrait) lay out at 48x60 inches with font size from 16-18. All parts of the research must be included in the poster presentation. Researchers are encouraged to prepare portfolio or any means of verification for further scrutiny of their innovations.

- 1. Research proponents participating the event must wear traditional or tribal attire to give light for the activity or celebration.
