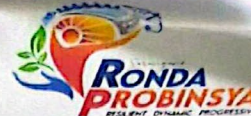

Subject: **DENGUE-SAFE SCHOOL thru BRIGADA-ESKWELA para sa BALIK-ESKWELA**

June 2026 marks the opening of classes wherein our pupils and students will return to school after the long academic break. It has been an established practice the Brigada-Eskwela among educational institutions to prepare classrooms and school facilities prior to the opening of classes. School personnel, parents, learners, and community members once again unite and voluntarily participate in cleaning, repairing, beautifying, and improving school surroundings to make the learning environment safe and conducive for education. Likewise, such endeavor also serves as an opportunity to protect learners from mosquito-borne diseases especially dengue which remains a continuing public health concern.

In line with this, we encourage all concerned personnel, partner agencies, and stakeholders to actively support and participate in this significant endeavor to ensure that school premises—both inside and outside classrooms—are clean, safe, and free from the threat of dengue-carrying mosquitoes.

Moreover, all school heads, teachers, and classroom in-charge are encouraged to implement the following basic vector control measures within school premises:

- Conduct **Search and Destroy** in all possible mosquito breeding areas through the implementation of the 4T's method – *Taob, Taktak, Tuyo at Takip*.
- Undertake **Space Spraying** for adult mosquitoes and **Larviciding**.
- Wash and re-install all received **Insecticide-Treated Screens**;
- Conduct **clean-up drives** within school premises.

Let us work together to promote a clean, healthy, and dengue-safe learning environment for all learners on this opening of classes.
