1. Relative to Regional Memorandum ESSD-2025-134, titled "Observance of the National Disaster Resilience Month (NDRM) 2026," which enjoins all members of the Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils and Committees, local government agencies, and other stakeholders to actively participate in the nationwide observance of NDRM 2026, the Schools Division Office (SDO) of Sarangani shall conduct the **School-Based Resilience Caravan 2026** on **September 15, 2026**, at the **Alabel Central Integrated SPED Center (ACISSC)**. The activity shall be conducted in partnership with the Office of Civil Defense Region XII (OCD XII), DepEd Regional Office XII, and the Local Government Unit of Alabel.

2. Anchored on the NDRM 2026 theme, "NAGHAHANDA at KUMIKILOS Tungo sa PANATAG na BAGONG PILIPINAS," the School-Based Resilience Caravan 2026 aims to strengthen the disaster preparedness and resilience of schools and communities by providing participants with practical knowledge, skills, and strategies on disaster risk reduction and management, emergency preparedness, response, and recovery. It likewise seeks to promote stronger collaboration and coordination among DepEd, local government units, disaster risk reduction and management offices, partner agencies, and other stakeholders in building safer, more resilient, and disaster-ready schools.

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Enclosure No. 2: Guidelines and Mechanics for the Contests

Bench Cheer Mechanics

School Resilience Caravan Bench Cheer Contest

Theme: "Naghahanda at Kumikilos Tungo sa Panatag na Bagong Pilipinas".

I. The activity shall be conducted throughout the duration of the main program, with participating SDO delegations being prompted at designated intervals to perform their respective cheers. It aims to create an energetic and engaging atmosphere while reinforcing the spirit of resilience, unity, preparedness, and collaboration among the participating SDOs.

II. Participants

1. The contest shall be participated in by the eight (8) participating Schools Division Offices (SDOs).
2. Each SDO shall organize its own Bench Cheer Team composed of at least seven (7) members, who shall be officially part of the participating SDO delegation.
3. An SDO may field more than seven (7) members, subject to the space and venue limitations.
4. The members of the Bench Cheer Team shall remain with or near their respective SDO delegation during the program and shall be ready to perform whenever prompted by the program facilitators or organizers.
5. Each SDO shall designate a Team Leader/Cheer Leader who shall coordinate the team's participation and ensure compliance with the mechanics.

III. Mechanics

1. Each SDO shall prepare one official Bench Cheer specifically for the School Resilience Caravan.
2. The cheer must reflect the theme of NDRM 2026 "Naghahanda at Kumikilos Tungo sa Panatag na Bagong Pilipinas"
3. The Bench Cheer shall have a minimum performance duration of three (3) minutes and a maximum duration of five (5) minutes.
4. The five-minute maximum shall apply to each complete prompted performance.
5. The Bench Cheer shall not be performed as one continuous presentation only. Instead, participating teams shall be prompted by the program facilitator at designated and appropriate intervals throughout the main program.
6. The number and timing of prompts shall be determined by the Program Committee and may vary depending on the flow of the program.
7. When prompted, all participating SDO teams shall be given the opportunity to perform their cheer, subject to the direction of the program facilitator.
8. The judges shall observe and evaluate the team's performance throughout the duration of the program and shall consider the consistency, energy, creativity, participation, and overall impact of the team's prompted performances.
9. Teams are encouraged to develop a cheer that can be performed effectively in their designated seating/bench area without requiring extensive movement across the venue.





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10. Teams may use appropriate, safe, and non-obstructive props, provided that these do not pose any safety risk, damage venue property, interfere with other participants, or disrupt the program.

11. The use of offensive, discriminatory, inappropriate, politically partisan, or otherwise unsuitable language, gestures, or materials shall not be allowed.

12. The cheer must be original or appropriately adapted by the participating SDO

13. The Bench Cheer must maintain the dignity and objectives of the National Disaster Resilience Caravan and shall promote a positive culture of safety, preparedness, resilience, and cooperation.

IV. Performance Time

Each SDO shall observe the following time requirement:

☐ Minimum: 3 minutes

☐ Maximum: 5 minutes

- A performance that exceeds five (5) minutes shall incur a 2-point deduction from the team's final score for every 30 seconds or fraction thereof beyond the five-minute limit.
- A performance shorter than three (3) minutes shall incur a 2-point deduction from the team's final score for every 30 seconds or fraction thereof below the required minimum.
- The official time shall be determined by the designated timekeeper.

V. Criteria for Judging

CRITERIA	PERCENTAGE
Relevance to the Theme, Disaster Resiliency and School Resilience Caravan	20%
Creativity and Originality – Uniqueness of concept, cheer composition, movements, formations, props, and presentation	20%
Energy, Enthusiasm and Audience Engagement – Vocal projection, enthusiasm, confidence, ability to energize and engage the audience	20%
Teamwork and Synchronization – Coordination, timing, unity, formation, and active participation of team members	15%
Clarity and Impact of Message – Strength, clarity, memorability, and positive impact of the resilience message	15%
Overall Performance and Entertainment Value – Stage/bench presence, discipline, creativity in execution, and overall impression	10%
TOTAL	100%





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VI. Performance and Judging

Since the Bench Cheer Competition shall take place throughout the program:

1. Judges shall observe the participating SDO teams during each prompted performance.
2. Judges may use a performance score sheet for every prompted round.
3. The scores from the different prompted performances shall be consolidated to determine the team's final score.
4. The consistency of performance shall be considered in determining the final rating.
5. Judges shall consider not only the team's initial performance but also its ability to maintain energy, enthusiasm, teamwork, and audience engagement throughout the program.
6. If an SDO is unable to perform when called due to a legitimate program-related reason, the Program Committee may provide an alternative performance opportunity, subject to the discretion of the organizers.

VIII. Prizes & Recognition

- ☐ Champion Team – Most Resilient SDO: Four Thousand Pesos (P4,000.00) and Certificate
- ☐ 1st Runner-up: Two Thousand Pesos (P3,000.00) and Certificate
- ☐ 2nd Runner-up: Two Thousand Pesos (P2,000.00) and Certificate
- ☐ Other teams will receive a consolation price of Five Hundred Pesos (500.00) each and Certificates of Participation.

IX. Determination of Winners

The winner shall be determined based on the highest consolidated score obtained from all judging rounds.

If there is a tie in the final score, the higher score in Energy, Enthusiasm and Audience Engagement shall be used as the next tie-breaker.

The decision of the Board of Judges shall be final and irrevocable.





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Quiz Bee Mechanics

School Resilience Caravan Quiz Bee

Theme: "Naghahanda at Kumikilos Tungo sa Panatag na Bagong Pilipinas".

1. Participants

- Each of the 8 divisions shall have a quiz bee participant composed of 2 students which will be chosen among the current participants present in the Regional School Resilience Caravan
- Total of 8 teams (16 students) shall compete.

2. Coverage

All questions will be based on the actual topics and discussions during the School Resilience Caravan sessions.

3. Rounds

The Quiz Bee shall consist of three (3) rounds:

A. Easy Round

- ☐ 8 questions, one per team.
- ☐ Each team answers individually.
- ☐ 1 point per correct answer.
- ☐ No stealing.
- ☐ Time Limit: 15 seconds to answer.

B. Average Round

- ☐ 10 questions in toss-up format.
- ☐ First team to raise the hands 5 seconds (after the quiz master started counting) after reading of the question gets to answer.
- ☐ 2 points for a correct answer.
- ☐ -1 point for an incorrect answer (to discourage random guessing).
- ☐ Time Limit: 15 seconds to answer once recognized.
- ☐ No conferring allowed during toss-up. (Team members are not allowed to talk to each other or discuss the answer during the toss-up round.)
- ☐ Only one person (whoever raises first) must answer

C. Difficult Round (Clincher Round)

- ☐ 10 questions, open to all teams
- ☐ Teams shall raise their answer after 15 second count which will commence after reading of the question
- ☐ 3 points per correct answer.
- ☐ No deduction for wrong answers.
- ☐ Teams may confer. (team members are allowed to talk to each other)
- ☐ In case of a tie, a sudden-death question will be asked.





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4. Rules and Guidelines

- ☐ Teams must be seated with visible identification.
- ☐ Contestants may only answer when recognized by the quizmaster.
- ☐ Use of gadgets, notes, or external help is strictly prohibited.
- ☐ Any form of misconduct may lead to disqualification.

5. Scoring and Judging

- ☐ A panel of three (3) judges shall validate answers and resolve disputes.
- ☐ Scoreboard will be projected or updated after each round.
- ☐ In case of question ambiguity or technical error, the judges' decision is final and irrevocable.
- ☐ The total score will determine the champion and the place of competing teams

6. Prizes and Recognition

- ☐ Champion Team: Three Thousand Pesos (P5,000.00) and Certificate
- ☐ 1st Runner-up: Two Thousand Pesos (P3,500.00) and Certificate
- ☐ 2nd Runner-up: Two Thousand Pesos (P2,500.00) and Certificate
- ☐ Other teams will receive a consolation price of One Thousand Pesos (P1000.00) each and Certificates of Participation.





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POSTER-MAKING CONTEST

Guidelines and Mechanics

RATIONALE:

Executive No. 029 renamed the National Disaster Consciousness Month to National Disaster Resilience Month and shifts its focus from disaster awareness building to disaster resilience.

Executive Order 29 s. 2017 declares the whole month of July each year as the National Disaster Resilience Month (NDRM) throughout the country and mandates the conduct of activities relative to building of disaster resilience covering the four thematic areas; prevention and mitigation, preparedness, response and rehabilitation and recovery.

This year, the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (NDRRMC), through the Office of Civil Defense (OCD), led the nationwide observance of the 38th National Disaster Resilience Month (NDRM) 2026 in July with the official theme, “NAGHAHANDA at KUMIKILOS tungo sa PANATAG na BAGONG PILIPINAS.” The theme affirms the Filipino people's collective commitment to disaster preparedness, safety, and resilience by highlighting the actions being undertaken by individuals, communities, and institutions across the country.

In support of this national observance, the Office of Civil Defense Regional Office (OCD) XII and the Regional Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (RDRRMC) XII continue the celebration through a series of regional activities conducted in August to September 2026. These activities aim to sustain public awareness, reinforce the importance of disaster prevention and mitigation, and strengthen the culture of preparedness and resilience across the SOCCSKSARGEN Region.

Originally scheduled for July 2026, the activities were rescheduled following the Magnitude 7.8 Offshore Sarangani Earthquake to allow government agencies and local government units to prioritize emergency response, relief distribution, and early recovery interventions in the affected communities.

Youth participation in disaster risk reduction and management is critical for fostering innovation, increasing resilience, empowering future leaders, ensuring sustainability, improving community mobilization, promoting social inclusion, and incorporating global perspectives into local practices.

Engaging the youth in DRRM programs fosters a culture of preparedness and responsiveness, which is essential for mitigating the impacts of disasters. To promote awareness and active participation among the youth, The Regional Disaster Risk Reduction and Management XII (RDRRMC XII) through the Office of Civil Defense XII (OCD XII) hereby organized a Poster-Making Contest. This event will encourage young people to express their ideas and understanding of DRRM



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through art, thereby enhancing their knowledge and commitment to disaster preparedness.

OBJECTIVES:

1. To raise awareness about DRRM programs among the youth sectors.
2. To encourage creative expression related to disaster preparedness and risk reduction.
3. To foster a sense of responsibility and proactive attitude towards community safety among young people.
4. To identify and recognize talented individuals who can serve as DRRM advocates in the community.

QUALIFIED PARTICIPANTS:

- The contest is open to bona fide Junior and Senior High School Students. Only one (1) representative or contestant per DepEd Schools Division is allowed to join.
- Family members of the OCD XII personnel are not allowed to join the said contest.

CONTEST MECHANICS AND GUIDELINES:

1. All participants are required to be at the venue 30 minutes before the contest proper for registration and instructions.
2. All artworks must be done onsite or on the spot and must be completed with the allotted time of three (3) hours. Manage your time wisely during the contest period.
3. Each participant should only submit one (1) entry.
4. The poster must illustrate, interpret and emphasize the National Disaster Resilience Month with the theme: “NAGHAHANDA at KUMIKILOS tungo sa PANATAG na BAGONG PILIPINAS.”
5. Use your own ideas and imagination. Avoid copying other posters.
6. The following materials will be provided by the Office of Civil Defense XII:
 - a. A ½ illustration board (as canvas for the artwork)
 - b. Basic coloring and art materials (Oil pastel, scissors, marker, and pencil)
7. Should the participants wish to use different/ other coloring materials, they are welcome to provide their own. Keep your work tidy. Erase unwanted marks and avoid smudging.
8. The poster must be done in free hand. Only hand-drawn posters are allowed (unless otherwise specified).
9. All entries must be pre-numbered. No other identifying marks will be allowed to appear in the artworks.
10. The participants will be held accountable for any issues that may arise regarding originality and authenticity of the design.





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GENERAL RULES:

1. Posters must not contain any offensive, discriminatory, or inappropriate content.
2. Plagiarism or copying from existing artworks will result in disqualification.
3. All entries shall become the property of OFFICE OF CIVIL DEFENSE XII SOCCSKSARGEN and may be used for future IEC and promotional materials.
4. Your poster should tell a story — make it clear, creative, and colorful!

11. CRITERIA FOR JUDGING:

Composition and Layout (Effective use of space, balance, and organization of elements.)	15%
Relevance to the theme (Does the poster clearly communicate the contest's theme or message?)	30%
Visual Impact (Overall attractiveness, neatness, and ability to catch attention.)	20%
Creativity and Originality (Uniqueness of the concept, style, and overall approach.)	25%
Overall Presentation (Cleanliness, completeness, and professionalism of the final output)	10%
TOTAL	100%

12. Winners will be awarded during the School-Based Resilience Caravan Closing Program on September 15, 2026.

13. Following the poster-making contest, ownership of all produced posters will be transferred to the OCD XII.

14. Winners will receive a Certificate of Recognition and cash incentives:

1st Place	PHP 5,000.00 and Plaque of Recognition
2nd Place	PHP 3,500.00 and Plaque of Recognition
3rd Place	PHP 2,500.00 and Plaque of Recognition
Finalist (5)	PHP 1,500 and Certificate of Recognition

Note: All cash prizes shall be subject to government accounting, auditing rules, and regulations.
